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Welcome back!

This week saw the return of some of our children to year R, year 1 and year 6, as well as those children who were already in during lockdown in year 2, 3, 4 and 5. The children have settled back into school life brilliantly, even though it is not quite the same as what they were used to. Below is a brief breakdown of how the school currently looks.

Year 6 is being taught across four classrooms by Miss Keeble, Mrs Gaunt, Miss Aldridge and Mrs Smallwood.

Year 1 is being taught across four classrooms by Miss Hynes, Miss Hutchins, Miss Wood and Miss Singleton.

Year R is being taught across four classrooms by Mrs Morgan, Mrs Moore, Mrs Haydon, Mrs Silvester, Mrs Griffiths and Mr Lovegrove.

Year 2 and 3 in one classroom are being taught by Mr Brewster.

Year 4 and 5 in one classroom are being taught by Mr Ewins.

Some of our teaching assistants are also placed within the classrooms above depending on the level of need, but none of our classes contain more than 15 children as dictated by government guidelines.

We are not at a full complement of staff as some remain either working from home or shielding due to falling into the vulnerable categories and we hope to welcome some of them back in the coming weeks.

Breaktimes and lunchtimes take place just for the class/group/bubble of children and they are not allowed to mix with any of our other bubbles. They have lunch in their classroom and Miss Eggleston and I have enjoyed delivering lunches to the children each day.

I would like to thank all of the parents that have brought children in each morning at the staggered drop off times – it has worked so smoothly. The same goes for the afternoon pick up as I know it must be difficult, but I really do thank you for your patience and co-operation during a very different school set-up.

We will continue to provide our online weekly learning schedules for those of you at home should you wish to use them and I know that many of you have received responses from some of our teaching staff that are currently working from home.

Also, thank you to those of you who have written in with kind words in regards to how you feel it has gone for you and your child during this first week.

If you are a parent of a child in year R, 1 and 6 and you are still unsure about a return to school, but perhaps are having second thoughts then do not hesitate to contact the office and we will do our very best to accommodate you if space is available.


Young Artists' Summer Show
