

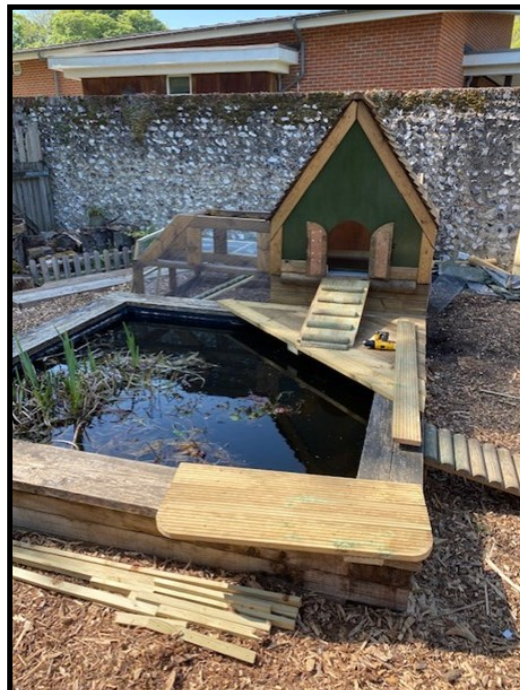

Cyber Ambassador Update

Please find below a message from the Police and Crime Commissioner Michael Lane.

I am writing to you all to let you know that my Cyber Ambassador Scheme, a peer-led initiative currently supporting Cyber Education in over 100 schools across Hampshire, the Isle of Wight, Portsmouth and Southampton has been further enhanced to allow access to online safety activities for all children and young people. This outstanding resource, designed to keep our young people and families safer online, can be accessed by all schools, through an online safety tab on my new coronavirus page on my website <https://www.hampshire-pcc.gov.uk/coronavirus>.

My objectives:

To ensure children and young people have the support they need during a time where they may be spending even more time on screens. The Cyber Ambassador Coordinator will send weekly emails with essential information for teachers, students and parents/ guardians. There will be updates, engagement with children and young people includes sharing online safety messages from Cyber Ambassadors and responding to issues arising due to the current situation, for example scams, gaming and daily online safety advice.

To ensure continued outreach identifying risks and sustaining & growing good cyber behaviours now and for a future post the current situation.

I hope you are all keeping well and will remain safe during this unsettling period. And can I close with a big THANK YOU in recognition of just how much has been achieved in these changed times by the education teams, teachers and our students.
