Dear Parents and Carers,

### Parent and Carer Questionnaire results

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the parental questionnaire that we sent out at the beginning of March. The final response rate was 78% which is incredible. Out of a total of 3720 questions, we only had 32 disagrees and 2 strongly disagrees – this equates to less than 1% of all questions answered returning a negative response.

Here are some of the headlines compared with our last survey at the end of the first lockdown in July (strongly agree and agree combined against disagree and strongly disagree).

*The school has ensured that there was learning available for my child every school day which he or she could access, regardless of ability = **99%** (+11% from July 2020)*

*The school has provided a good range of creative learning for my child = **99%** (+24%)*

*The live lessons and/or recorded inputs by teaching staff engaged my child and made it easier for me and my child to understand the learning = **99%** (+34%)*

*The feedback given to my child online has informed my child about what he or she has done well, and what they need to do in order to progress = **97%** (+39%)*

*When I have experienced difficulty with my child's home learning, the school has supported me = **99%** (+22%)*

*The school has worked hard to keep in contact with my child throughout lockdown = **98%** (+32%)*

*The school has communicated well with parents and carers throughout lockdown = **99%** (+22%)*

*I am confident that if I contact school regarding a concern or with a query, someone will respond promptly = **100%** (+13%)*

*Both questions relating to children being safe and happy at school, from their viewpoint and yours = **100%***

*My family has continued to feel valued at school = **99%** (+28%)*

I always said that we knew that there were many aspects first time around which we knew we could do better, so that when lockdown hit again then we would be ready to provide a much-improved learning experience for both you and your children. These results and the many messages of support that we received during lockdown, after lockdown and through the so, so generous 'GoFundMe' page have made us all feel so proud of the work we have all put in. Hopefully, this will be the end of it now and we will never have to endure another lockdown. Since returning to school the children have been as spectacular as ever in their learning and it is such a good feeling to walk around the building and see every classroom full. That's how we like it.

I will leave you with a message of support from each year group that was left on the questionnaire. Apologies if you recognise it as your own as I haven't asked permission, but there were so many I had to share at least some of them. Reading them again genuinely fills me with real emotion and we cannot thank you enough.

**Year R** ~ I would just like to say, once again, a massive thank you to everyone at the school for all the hard work that has been put in to providing videos and resources for home learning and all the support via email and teams calls etc. It has all been very much appreciated.

**Year 1** ~ The school and staff have worked tirelessly over the last 12 months to educate our children. The staff have been absolutely amazing and prioritised the well-being and education of the children and I would like to thank them all for their hard work.

**Year 2** ~ We have been extremely impressed by the hard work and dedication of KWP teaching and support staff through this period. Excellent work and strong leadership, delivered with kindness, sensitivity and a great sense of humour. Give yourselves an Outstanding!

**Year 3** ~ A huge thank you to everyone at the school, nothing short of amazing! My children's teachers have been so supportive and worked so hard, cannot thank you all enough! We feel very lucky to have our children at the school. Thanks to every single member of staff at KW Primary.

**Year 4** ~ A really fantastic effort by all the staff in Y4, helping to keep both my child engaged, happy and motivated throughout the lockdown. I would never have believed such young children could have been inspired to keep going with 4 hours of online learning every day, but you have shown what can be done!

**Year 5** ~ I cannot fault the school's approach to this lockdown, it's been amazing! The live lessons have enabled my husband and I to continue working whilst knowing that our children are continuing with their education. We cannot thank you enough. The improvement compared to the last lockdown has been phenomenal.

**Year 6** ~ Huge appreciation for the effort put in by staff during this lockdown. My children have been home throughout and have still felt part of the school community, helping them to be more independent home learners. I believe this has helped them returning to school (on March 8<sup>th</sup>) with a lot less anxiety than after the first lockdown. Bravo KWPS!

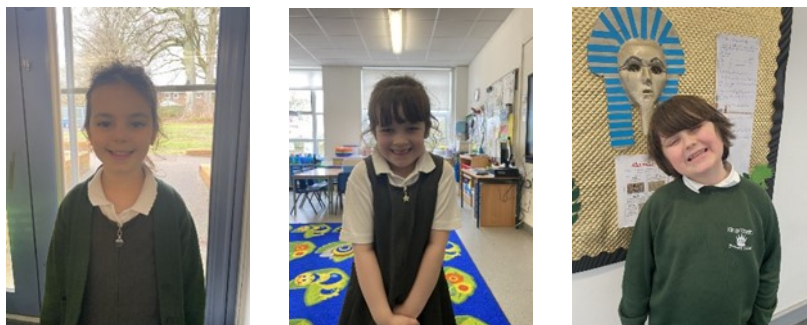

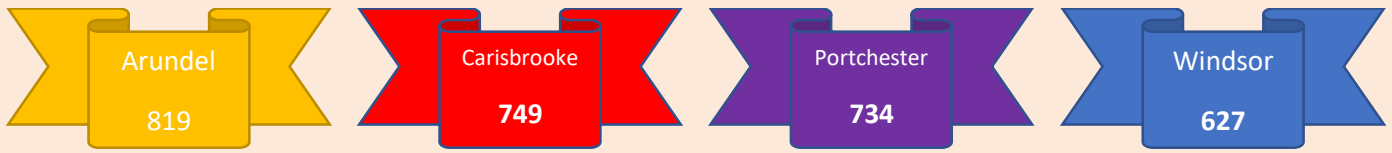


A special mention goes to Penny in Reception, Bea in year 2 and Tomas in year 4 for their entries.

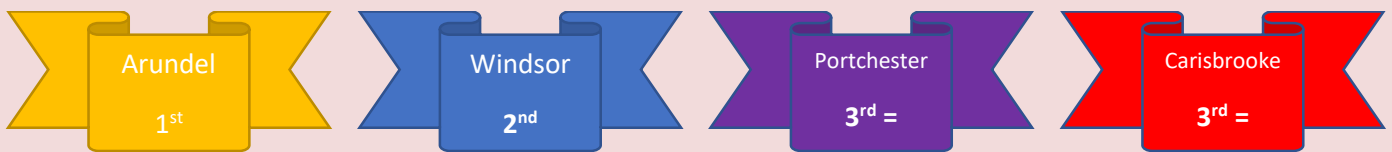
