Oh my goodness – are we only 3 weeks before the end of term? In line with current government guidance I would like to inform you of some of the December activities due to take place in the coming weeks.

- Christmas lunch is due to take place in the last week of term and we are hoping to get all year groups in the hall over the course of **Thursday 17**th **December** (maintaining year group bubbles of course).
 - Special mention must go to Angela and the team in the kitchen for making this possible. They have been doing an amazing job in the past few weeks, not only in providing our fabulous school lunches, but delivering them to classrooms too.
- Christmas jumper day falls on *Friday December 11th*, for which the children will wear their school uniform on their lower halves, with a Xmas jumper on their upper halves. We are requesting a £1 donation towards 'Save the Children' for this day.
- Also, on *Friday December 11th*, we are introducing a Christmas Party afternoon for the children. As we are not allowed to share food, the children will need to bring a packed lunch of party food to enjoy at lunchtime. As it is a special day, we are happy for you to pack some extra treats for your child. There will be no cooked dinners on this day, but the kitchen will provide pizza for all children in EYFS and KS1 (if they don't want to bring a packed lunch), plus all children in receipt of the pupil premium grant. If your child would like to bring juice, then that is fine, but no fizzy drinks should be brought to school. There will be no PE on this day.
- Due to the logistics of quarantining and safe distribution across the school, we will **not** be having the post box for Christmas cards and I ask that your child does not bring in cards to give out to children in their class. I know that this might be disappointing for some of the children, but the more pressing concern is that card distribution from one household into another might result in the transmission of Covid across households. If your child brings cards into school, we will not allow him or her to give them out, so I would ask that you do not put us or them in that position. If your child would like to write a card for the whole class the teacher will put this on display in the classroom.
- On that same note, the teachers will not be giving individual Christmas cards to their class.
- Unfortunately, we are not able to perform our annual nativity in Year R and Christmas play in Year 1 and 2.
 This is due to being unable to have too many children in the hall in close proximity to each other, which would also involve singing (something which has been discouraged in schools during the pandemic). Mrs Morgan and the key stage one team are all hard at work coming up with something for you all to still be able to enjoy.
- Despite the prime minister's guidance on a lowering of restrictions and lockdown ending next week, we have decided to continue with our phased drop off and pick up. This has seen a significant reduction in numbers of people on the school site, particularly at the end of the day. We will look at this again before the end of term, so that you know the expectations come January. I will send out further instructions about the final day of term nearer the time, but phased collection will likely be from 1.15pm to 1.45pm.

Finally, I would like to say thank you for your continued support. The children have worked incredibly hard this term and with 3 weeks to go we will continue to push them forward with their learning. I visit all classrooms in some way every single day and their attitude to learning and behaviour has been a pleasure for us all to see.

No Pens Day Wednesday

This week we had our annual 'No Pens Day Wednesday'. It was wonderful to walk around all of the classrooms and see the creative ways they had of completing maths and English lessons without the use of pens or pencils. There were lots of speaking and listening activities, as well as art, practical activities in maths, and drama performances.




Parking
