Science Week 2021

Last week was our whole school science week, we were thinking about the skills needed to be a scientist such as observation, noticing patterns, asking questions and explaining our reasoning. Across the week, there were lots of fun, practical science activities linked to our topics, here's a taster of what was happening in different classes:

Year R

In year R, the theme for their week was bees; the children planted wildflowers, tasted

honey and learned about pollination. In the Woodland Walk the children turned into busy worker bees, 'pollinating' each other

with cheesy crisps. They swapped their cheesy crisps with each other and then wiped their hands-on paper flowers to imitate how pollen sticks to a bee's legs and then gets transferred between flowers.









Year 4

In year 4, their science topic this half term is electricity. The children investigated using fruit as a battery to make their bulb light up. "We tried to do it, but it didn't work straight away. We did some research and found out that it had to be parallel. We needed 4 lemons to make it light up." – Finn 4B

Year 5

In year 5, the children performed an experiment called 'the floating bottle' where the children had to try and lift a bottle containing rice using only a single chopstick. They discovered that they had to really tightly pack the rice into the bottle so that there was no room for anymore, then when they put the chopstick into the bottle the friction caused by the tightly packed rice was strong enough to hold the chopstick in place even when it was lifted up, allowing the bottle to 'float' in the air!




