Some of the things written in the final report from the day included:

'the teachers have developed a learning environment that provides a wide range of open-ended resources which the children can use to engage in rich independent learning opportunities.'

'All children were engaged and adults were skilfully involved in supporting learning.'

'Independence is clearly encouraged and fostered therefore enabling the adults to engage in sustained interactions to develop the children's learning.'




Clubs return for 5 weeks only!
