It's also brilliant to welcome back many of our staff who were not in school at all during the recent lockdown, but especially Mrs Katie O'Sullivan who has been away from school for many months and I know I speak for everyone when I say that we're delighted Katie is back and raring to get started. She will be working mostly in year 4 in the coming weeks.

Farewell to Mrs Caldbeck

We didn't get an opportunity to say goodbye at the end of the summer term to Mrs Caldbeck who retired after a marathon teaching career spanning 46 years. Mrs Caldbeck first worked in London, then as a supply teacher in several local schools before teaching at Kings Worthy for the last 32 years - our longest serving member of staff in recent years! I first met Mrs Caldbeck 28 years ago and will always remember her kindness and hospitality to me as a new member of staff. During her time at Kings Worthy, she's worked for numerous headteachers, taught every year group from YR to Y6, led English, History, Music and Art, mentored students on teaching practice, accompanied children on a variety of (still memorable!) day and residential trips, moved classroom at least 8 times and taught approximately 1000 children as a class teacher and many more in her part-time role. Amongst so many memories over the years, Mrs Caldbeck remembers when there were just 7 classrooms in our main building plus a couple of huts as the numbers grew, moving into Hinton House with its stunning views but some less than ideal classroom layouts, and the subsequent construction of the new KS2 building. Throughout the years, Mrs Caldbeck has particularly encouraged the children to develop a love of both music and reading. She's enabled the children to participate in music-making in so many forms, from rehearsing end-ofterm shows to singing with our choir at the Albert Hall, working with the late composer Martin Read to give the children the opportunity to compose original music and perform it with professional musicians, to more recently organising concert visits for our Y6 children, some of whom loved this so much that it was "their favourite part of the year". Past pupils remember both her kindness and how her love of drama, bringing books alive, 'got them into reading'. Mrs Caldbeck will now have more time to spend with her family (around whom the BBC drama 'Mrs Wilson' is based) and we wish her a long and very happy retirement. (written by Miss Keeble)

Drop-off and pick-up changes (part 2)

Thank you to all of you who have followed our guidelines for coming in first thing in the morning. Due to the nature of our slightly staggered morning drop off arrangements I feel that there is no need to change how we come in first thing in the morning. Miss Eggleston and I have been on both gates and feel that it has run very smoothly. I know that on the first day you are eager to see your child into the classroom, but I would urge parents of children from year 4, 5 and 6 to drop them at the gate and let them walk to class on their own.

I would prefer every one to follow the one-way system and exit through the top gate, but if you are a blue badge holder then you are able to return the way you came in, maintaining social distancing.


Pick-up arrangements proved a little more difficult.

From Monday I would like all parents who are collecting children from year 4, 5 and 6 to come in the way they come in first thing in the morning.

If you are collecting from year R, 1, 2 and 3 then please enter through the bottom gate. If you have no siblings to collect then simply walk round and out through the 4, 5, 6 entry gate – there should be minimal crossover as parents picking up will likely already be on the school site.

If you are picking up siblings from 4, 5 and 6 as well as a child from R, 1, 2 and 3 then follow the blue route and exit through the top gate which will be open.

This will hopefully maintain our one-way system much better and ease congestion through the top gate exit point.



Black route - Year 4, 5 and 6 parents collection route

Red route – Year 1, 2 and 3 collection route

Blue route – 4, 5 and 6 siblings collection route

Apologies for the simplistic map and updated plans, but if we encounter problems then we will of course adapt as necessary.

Why not a staggered start or end to the school day?

This seems to be the most common question that I am being asked at the moment so I thought I would provide you with our reasons for not doing this.

The guidance around staggered start and finish times is that schools should consider it and it isn't one of the 'musts' that we have to put in place.

Before full re-opening to all year groups in the second half of the summer term we were able to operate a successful staggered start and finish time. This was due to a reduced number of children on site and we were able to shorten the school day to allow this for all year groups.

The full re-opening guidance states that if we were to operate staggered drop-offs and pick-ups for all year groups then all children must retain their usual daily amount of teaching time. This means we would have to reduce break-time and lunch-time length to still ensure that everyone could be off-site by 3.30pm. Our break-time and lunch-time has already taken significant planning as we have to keep all our year groups separate. We of course have many year groups with siblings, meaning that we would require some parents to enter the school site for one child at one time and then return to the school site a significant time later to collect the other children. We could potentially have people waiting on the playground or congregating outside and around the school site.

I'm sure you can also appreciate that we have many adults in school who also have their own children at different schools. We have to make reasonable allowances for them so that they are able to fit in with their own child's school plans. Inevitably I would have to change the start and end times for all year groups which would cause issues in how we are able to cover classes.


I have included the DfE guidance regarding arriving and leaving school below.

Measures for arriving at and leaving school

We know that travel to school patterns differ greatly between schools. If those patterns allow, schools should consider staggered starts or adjusting start and finish times to keep groups apart as they arrive and leave school. Staggered start and finish times should not reduce the amount of overall teaching time. A staggered start may, for example, include condensing/staggering free periods or break time but retaining the same amount of teaching time, or keeping the length of the day the same but starting and finishing later to avoid rush hour. Schools should consider how to communicate this to parents and remind them about the process that has been agreed for drop off and collection, including that gathering at the school gates and otherwise coming onto the site without an appointment is not allowed.

New Early Years Outdoor area

Back in July work commenced on improving our outdoor area for our Year R pupils. From my very first look round the school, before I was even appointed, I remember thinking this was a part of the school that needed developing. When the Hampshire Early Years advisors came to visit the school they also commented that if we were able to improve our outdoor area then it would make a massive difference for our children when they start at Kings Worthy. Below are some of the before and after pictures and we're all incredibly happy for our new children to start next week so that they can reap the benefit of what we have installed. Hopefully some of our other projects that we have had to put on hold due to the pandemic will see the light of day as the year progresses too.



<u>Year 4</u>

Our first day in year 4 was lots of fun! In the afternoon our teachers set us a challenge which was to step through a piece of A4 paper! I was confused because the paper was so small and I thought it was impossible! But after lots of careful cutting we made one piece of paper into a big circle that we could step through. It was surprising! We then were given an A3 piece of paper in a pair and our task was to make the longest line we could. We then joined with the rest of our group to make one long line. From just 4 pieces of paper we made a line that was 19 metres long. Unfortunately, we didn't win and a group in 4B won the challenge making a line of 48 metres! It is regarded as recommended practice for schools to have duplicates of inhalers so that one is with the child (in class) and one is in the Medical Room. All medication should be in date and you are asked to check this and replace as appropriate.

With the new school year now underway, please can I enlist your support to enable your child(ren) to enjoy the best possible level of attendance – especially after so much time missed by everyone over the last few months.

Late Arrivals

Please continue to bring your child into the school reception area, if a late arrival has been unavoidable or preplanned. Your child will be encouraged to proceed to class independently or escorted by a member of staff, where appropriate.

New Reading Diaries

The children have enjoyed receiving their new reading diaries this week with their bespoke school covers. As a school, we really want the children to enjoy reading experiences both at school and at home. The reading diary is a way for staff to keep track of what the children are reading and to support you at home as a learning resource as it has helpful word lists and definitions inside. Teachers will check these diaries weekly and we would encourage the children to read at least four times per week at home independently, with an adult or a sibling. Reading at least four times per week and having the diary signed by an adult will earn them three house points!
