Dear Parents and Carers,

May 17th be with you!

As we edge closer to the next set of restrictions being eased on May 17th I feel today is the right time to let you know of some of the upcoming changes planned in school.

I would like all year groups to return to normal school timings from May 17th – that means an 8.45am-9.00am start and a 3.30pm finish. We will no longer operate our staggered drop-offs and pick-ups. I would still like children to enter through the same locations and the one-way system also remains for adults dropping off. The government states that 'people should continue to social distance from anyone not in their household' so I would ask that you are sensible in how you congregate when on the school site. Also, the required wearing of face-masks when on the school site outside will no longer be mandatory – it is up to you whether or not you want to continue wearing a face mask outside on the school site. If, however, you request a meeting with a member of staff within the school site then masks will still be required.

These are decisions that we have not taken lightly and I know that some of you will be delighted with a return to normal school times. However, if you would still like to drop-off your child or pick-up at the previous staggered times then that is also permitted. All I ask is that you contact the school admin team stating the year groups of your child(ren) and the times you would like to drop-off and pick-up in line with what we had in place previously. It is important that we know so that the teachers are able to plan accordingly.

In Winchester, there were 11 cases per 100,000 people in the week 26^{th} April to 2^{nd} May. The average area in England had 16.

4954 cases across the week nationally (compare this to Boxing Day - 3^{rd} January when they were reporting 70,000 new cases a day)

These figures are taken from the government's coronavirus dashboard.

I think as restrictions continue to ease and we edge closer to normality there can be the feeling that everything is now ok, but it is important to remember that we are not quite out of the woods yet. No confirmed child cases and no confirmed adult cases amongst the Kings Worthy team is down to how well we have conducted ourselves as a community through this past year. We still need to observe the restrictions put in place, even though they (hopefully) continue to ease. Do not hesitate to contact the school through the normal channels should you wish to discuss anything with me further.

This is of course subject to change according to government guidance.

Remember, these changes come into force from Monday 17th May (not Monday 10th).





