### Half term approaching...

I always like to look back at my newsletter from the previous year just to see what was going on in school and lo and behold the opening heading for this week last year was 'Coronavirus update'. February 14<sup>th</sup> 2020 was the first time that I had used what is now the word of the century. Who could've predicted what was to come next?

What a year, from then to now. Just over a month later and we were in our first lockdown. How much have we gone through as a school community? Firstly, we were told that we had to provide childcare for a handful of children, then only certain year groups were allowed back, with no real guidance for online provision provided. We were literally trying to do all we could and the best we could. No one was telling us how. Fast forward to lockdown 3 and we have, on average, over 140 children in school each day, being taught in classrooms whilst able to see their classmates doing the same lessons at home. Our aim was to try and keep the school day as normal as possible for everyone, both at school and at home and we hope that in some way we have managed that.

In my half term message to our staff yesterday I said that the education profession was one of the most adaptable in the world. This last 6 weeks has certainly seen that. Two weeks ago, I had never even heard of 'Jamboard' (it's a tool to help improve lessons on google classroom for those of you who don't know, not a board for making jam sandwiches) and then last Monday we were doing a mini staff meeting on it.

On January 5<sup>th</sup> when we were all in school preparing to go online with lessons on January 6<sup>th</sup> I cannot lie that there was a certain amount of trepidation coursing through the school. Would it work? Will the technology hold up? Could the children at home login each day? Would we still be able to teach the children in the classroom as well as those at home?

Nothing can replicate the interaction that takes place within the classroom, but we have tried our very best. And we're still improving. I have thanked the Kings Worthy school team in one or two of these newsletters already, but they have worked incredibly hard this half term and believe you me are ready for a rest. I don't want to tempt fate, but I strongly believe that all children will be back in school on March 8<sup>th</sup>. Let's keep everything crossed. Hopefully only 2 more weeks to go after half term. We can do this!

Miss Eggleston and I have tried to respond in person to every thank you message that has been written in to school. Those emails have kept us going, so thank you to everyone who took the time to do it. We have had our low moments, but they acted as a pick me up to everyone as I shared every single message with the whole team.

Also, if you contributed to the 'GoFundMe' page I would also like to say thank you. When I learnt that it had been set up I didn't expect anywhere near what was raised. It was another lift to all in school in some of those darker moments. The filtered water dispenser in our staff room is used daily and we still have plenty of funds left.

Finally, to our brilliant children. They have done so well, both at home and at school and I can't wait to be on the gate, all being well very soon, to say good morning to all of you again. We are already planning how to ensure every child catches up so that they are right where they should be. With such a strong team I know we can do it.

Half term is normally a time when we can all get away for a few days and catch up with friends and family. Not this one unfortunately, but I do hope you are able to relax. Don't worry about turning that computer on at 9am ready for online learning. Try and have a lie in; read a good book; get lost in a boxset or two; jump in some muddy puddles on a big walk; phone someone you've not spoken to for a few weeks; and of course, toss a pancake on Tuesday.

After half term we will celebrating World Book Day both virtually and in school. More information about how you can join in to follow. Why not make a small donation to this amazing charity and sit back to enjoy a fun story with me during lockdown.






### What do you appreciate?





