Dear Parents and Carers,

Monday morning edging closer to normality!

So, we are moving into Step 3 of the government roadmap on **Monday 17**th **May** and as I stated in last week's newsletter we will be making a few changes.

All year groups to return to normal school timings from Monday – that means an 8.45am-9.00am start and a 3.30pm finish.

Unless you have contacted the school office directly there will be no staggered drop-offs and pick-ups. All gates are now accessible for entry or exit – the one-way system is no longer in place.

All gates will be locked at 9am each morning.

If you are dropping off or picking up at the staggered timings then please drop-off/pick up at the school office (we currently have only a handful of requests for this to continue).

The government states that 'people should continue to social distance from anyone not in their household' so I would ask that you are sensible in how you congregate when on the school site.

The required wearing of face-masks when on the school site outside will no longer be mandatory – it is up to you whether or not you want to continue wearing a face mask outside on the school site.

If you request a meeting with a member of staff within the school site then masks will still be required.

If you would still like to drop-off your child or pick-up at the previous staggered times then that is still available as an option. Please contact the school admin team stating the names and year groups of your child(ren) and the times you would like to drop-off and pick-up in line with what we had in place previously. It is important that we know so that the teachers are able to plan accordingly.

Infection rates are at their lowest level since September 2020, while hospital admissions and patients in hospital continues to decrease.

In Winchester, there were 8 cases per 100,000 people in the week 2^{nd} May to 8^{th} May. The average area in England had 16.

4961 cases across the week nationally (at its peak, they were reporting 70,000 new cases a day). These figures are taken from the government's coronavirus dashboard.

Once again, I would like to stress that although we are lifting many of the school restrictions that have been in place for many weeks we must continue to adhere to the government guidance so that we remain a Covid free school community. And of course, if you are not comfortable with any of these changes, you have the choice to continue as before.

It has been amazing to see children from year 2 and 3 return to the school hall for lunches this week (remaining in their year group bubbles naturally), joining the children from year 1 and year R. Seeing them smiling and waving to their friends as they eat has been an absolute delight.

Do not hesitate to contact the school through the normal channels should you wish to discuss anything with me further.

Remember, these changes come into force from Monday 17th May.

Felix - 'We found different habitats, like a woodlouse that lived on a tree.'


Emily C - 'We were surprised because we found lots of slugs that lived on deadwood and I thought they would live on living trees.'


Polly - 'I was surprised that we had so many slugs in our woodland!'
