There is currently a buzz of excitement amongst children and staff in anticipation of our Aladdin production; we are thrilled to be able to share the hard work all children have been putting into the show in less than two weeks' time!

Tickets went on sale yesterday for the production which will be taking place at Hope Church, Winchester on *Tuesday 20th and*

Wednesday 21st **July** starting at 7:00pm. If the government's planned easing of lockdown continues, we will be able to offer 700 tickets per night of the production. However, if restrictions continue beyond this date, we will be limited to 150 tickets per night, so please ensure to get your orders in early!

Tickets are priced at £5 per adult and £2.50 per child, and are able to be bought through the usual Scopay system used for other school events. Ticket sales are open now and close on *Thursday 15th July* in order for us to send tickets home in time for the performances. These tickets will include the two winning designs from the Key Stage 2 Aladdin Ticket Design competition run earlier this term.

We really would love this to be a whole school celebration and the children will really benefit from a huge audience. It will likely be the first time for so long that many of us will have been to an event of this size and therefore we really want our whole school community to attend. Not just the friends and families of the children taking part. The ticket prices are to cover the costs of the show and any extra money made will go back into drama productions for the future as we want this to become a huge annual event.

The children and production team cannot wait to share this performance with you, and we do hope you will join us on one of the above dates to celebrate together.

Library Books

Please may the children return **ALL** library books to the school library by Friday 16th July. We will be conducting our annual stock check in the final week of the term so would really appreciate all the library books returned. Many thanks for your support with this.

Summer Reading

The online library service is still accessible and can be used over the summer. If you haven't already signed up or unsure what it is, we previously organised a way that the children can 'borrow' books from our library and receive them as eBooks or audiobooks, AMAZING!

All that is required is for you to search this website https://kingsworthy-hantssls.eplatform.co/ or download the app ePlatform by Wheelers from your smartphone or tablet.

Once you are on the website or have the app, the children can then sign in, search for Kings Worthy Primary School and start browsing the eBooks available. To sign in the children will require their barcode number which can be found on their library barcode in their reading journals (it will be a four-digit number) then type in **book** as the password and then you will need to search for our school to enter the library stock, then you can begin browsing. The eplatform is aware of your child's age so may show books that are too difficult, but your child will not be able to borrow them as that process will be disabled. You are able to search titles or authors and can filter for specific genres. Children can also reserve/requests books too.

Please do get in touch if you have any issues.

Also, the Summer Reading Challenge is something your child can participate in which you can join through your local library.





Thinking of returning to your role as a healthcare professional? We can help you!
