## Reminder of message sent to all parents earlier in the week

Unfortunately, due to the government pushing back re-opening until Monday 19<sup>th</sup> July I am now in a position to update you on one or two events that we had originally planned for the remaining weeks of term.

Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> July – Sports Day – CANCELLED. DfE guidance states that Sports Days can still go ahead, however it would be a logistical nightmare to organise this on the school site. For example, all children must remain in their year group bubbles and sports equipment should be cleaned throughout the event. Spectators would be expected to adhere to social distancing guidelines and gather in groups of 30. For an event like this, I have to consider worst case scenario and if there was a confirmed case on the day or next day. It would be impossible to collect the correct information as to who they were near; did they adhere to the guidelines; did they cross into another year group – likely if siblings are involved. This all means that I could end up with a situation of closing multiple year groups before the end of term. With this in mind, we will still run Sports Day, but without spectators and in a format where year groups remain in bubbles.

**Wednesday 14**<sup>th</sup> **July – Open evening for current parents.** This event is an opportunity to discuss the end of year report with your child's class teacher. In line with other parent's evenings this year, this event will now be virtual.

*Friday 16<sup>th</sup> July – PTFA Woodland Wonderland Evening – CANCELLED.* Similar to the restrictions around Sports Day I once again have to look at worst case scenario. The PTFA are devastated to have to cancel this event as we were deep into the planning and finalising stages.

**Tuesday and Wednesday 20/21 July – ALADDIN – GOES AHEAD AS PLANNED.** As this event is due to take place after the new re-opening date we are still looking forward to ending the year the best way we can. As we are also performing at Hope Church in Winchester (which has a much larger capacity than our school hall) we will be able to better adhere to social distancing guidelines.

After the year we have had, these decisions are never easy and I would like to thank you in advance for your understanding in the above matters.

# **Football Megastars**




They have won the South Coast Junior Premier League winning every game home and away which is amazing. This progressed them to the regionals which includes every county below the Midlands.
