Curriculum Task	This week's task is linked to the English work you'll be doing about persuasive writing.  We've been learning about Brazil in our topic sessions at school. This week we have focused on the Amazon Rainforest- the largest jungle in the world. It is an incredibly diverse area that is home to an incredible number of animals and plants.  Rainforests are being cut down at an alarming rate. An area of rainforest the size of a football pitch is cut down every few seconds. There are lots of reasons why this is a bad thing.
