Task History & Art	 Thank you to Patrick's parents who kindly made this video about Roman Winchester: https://youtu.be/96TR-Fawb20. The A33 (which runs through Kings Worthy) was built by Romans. Look at the map of the UK that we have uploaded (or, even better, use an atlas at home). The Romans had different names for our towns, for example London was known as 'Lindum'. Modern town names ending in '-chester', '-caster' or '-cester' was once as Roman town (e.g. Winchester). 1. Can you find/highlight the Roman towns on the map? 2. On a new, blank map, write the Roman name for these towns in the correct location. 3. Add in where you think the Romans built roads to link up these towns by following the following rules. © Roads are straight (or as straight as can be!) © Roads radiate out from London. Put these in first, to the nearest towns. © Roads link up each town. 4. Compare your map to the Roman Britain map that we have uploaded. How are they similar? How are they different?
	 Design a pop-up Roman landmark Build a pop-up card inspired by Roman arenas (such as the Colosseum in Rome or the Arena in Verona). Examples and instructions can be found on our Year 4 page.
