This week it would be eat if you could spend some time focusing on your numbers 1-20. We would love it if you could make sure your child can identify the numbers without pport, order the numbers correctly, identify one more and one less than a given number and compare two numbers talking about which is the bigger umber and which is the smaller number. Below are a few practical activities children can do, there is also a selection of different activities on our class area.
	pc	age. - Number hunt around your house using numbers written on pieces of paper.
		- Can the children make their own number line, placing the numbers in the correct order.
		- Play a game of 'Which number is missing?'. Children lay their numbers out and an adult or family member removes one, can they identify which one is missing?
		- Play a game of 'I'm thinking of a numberwhich is one more than 10'. Children need to see if they can identify the number you are thinking of.
