Topic I Extreme USA

A geographical study of hurricanes, tornadoes and earthquakes, their causes and impact.

Key questions:

- What are hurricanes, tornadoes and earthquakes?
- Why do they affect some regions of the USA but not others?
- How do they affect people living in different regions of the USA?

Art:

Pop art – inspired by Roy Lichtenstein and Jasper Johns

English:

- Writing a newspaper report
- Using hurricanes as a theme and stimulus for diary writing, focusing on creating tension and suspense
- Writing an earthquake information sheet
- Revision and extension of grammar; labelling and understanding different word types e.g. noun, verb, adjective

Maths:

- Place Value
- Four operations, using mental calculations to help solve these and finding the most efficient method
- Factors and Multiples
- Order of Operations

Science: Light

- Does light travel in straight lines?
- How does the eye see objects?
- How are shadows formed?

Computing:

- Image editing to create Pop Art
- Online safety risk
- Breaking a sequence into small steps to create an algorithm

- Has the way we catch and punish criminals improved that much in the last 100 years?
