Reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read for at least twenty minutes each day. • Choose an activity each day from the Reading Rainbow Activities (Week 2). • Have a look at Serial Mash which has just been added to PurpleMash – there are lots of free books to read online. If PurpleMash is busy, read a real book!
Handwriting	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Choose an extract from the book you have read each day (this may be a sentence or a longer paragraph). Copy the extract out in your neatest handwriting, making sure to spell the words you are copying correctly.
Writing	<p>By the end of this week you will have a published final copy of a poem. Use the following steps to help you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read the poem 'If' by Rudyard Kipling – listen to the poem here https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=AUQPHkYLayM or read it from the copy on the website. • Reflect and respond to the poem. What do you like? How does it make you feel? How is it set out? What language can you identify? • Use the poem to answer some comprehension questions about the poem (choose the level right for you) • Create your own poem – you might want to use the opening lines from 'If' to start you off or you may want to write your own. • Edit and improve your poem before making a neat and final copy.

Remember to look back at, and correct any errors you may have made. • Complete the multiplication and division task which has been set as a 2Do on PurpleMash. Curriculum Task	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This week we will focus on RE and look at the theme of sacrifice. • Make a mind map to explore what your initial thoughts on sacrifice are. You can add to your mind map as you go. • Watch this clip from The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HQ6VAGyhWXM What did Aslan do? Why? • Watch the Easter Story https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HL8R158Ujp4 How do these clips compare? • What does sacrifice mean to you? Can you think of a time when you put yourself last or gave up something for someone else or a cause? Draw or write about your sacrifice. • Think about what people are sacrificing in their lives now. Write a letter to thank someone who is currently making a sacrifice – someone who works in a hospital or a delivery driver taking food to people at home. It doesn't have to be a specific person.
