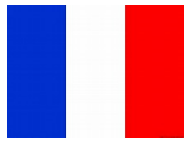

What do we need to remember when writing the days and months in French?

Now let's learn the seasons in French:

l'été

l'hiver

l'automne

le printemps

Can you guess which is which? Do any look the same as the English?

l'été = summer

l'automne = autumn

l'hiver = winter

le printemps = spring

- Go back to find the seasons (without 'l' or 'le' in front) in the wordsearch.
- Pellmanism - Make a pair game to play with at least one other person. Write the French and English words on separate cards. Days, months and seasons. Grid attached to cut up, if required. You could use a different colour for each language. Turn all the cards upside down. Take it in turns to turn over two cards. If you find a pair, you keep it and have another go. If they aren't a pair, put them back where you picked them up from. The winner is the player with the most pairs at the end of the game.
