Topic I Extreme USA

A geographical study of hurricanes, tornadoes and earthquakes, their causes and impact.

Key questions:

- What are hurricanes, tornadoes and earthquakes?
- Why do they affect some regions of the USA but not others?
- How has New York changed over time?
- How is it different from Winchester?

Art:

Pop art – inspired by Roy Lichtenstein and Jasper John

English:

- Writing discussion texts to show different points of view.
- Using hurricanes as a theme and stimulus for diary writing, focusing on creating tension and suspense
- Writing an earthquake information sheet
- Revision and extension of grammar; labelling and understanding different word types e.g. noun, verb, adjective

Maths:

- Mental calculations using all 4 number operations
- Revision of formal written methods and applying these to problem solving

Science: Light

- Does light travel in straight lines?
- How does the eye see objects?
- How are shadows formed?

Computing:

- Image editing to create Pop Art
- Online safety risk
- Breaking a sequence into small steps to create an algorithm
- Scratch coding

Music: Creating musical effects to suggest extreme weather.

PE:

Gymnastics: balances and creating sequences of movement on the floor and apparatus **Games**: tag rugby

RE:

Journeys - Why might a journey be special; to whom and why? Look at pilgrimages made by people of different faiths
